WHY THIS CAMPAIGN?

Hazards 'in the line of fire' are one of the most common in the oil and gas industry.*

The campaign 'Don't get caught in the line of fire' is meant to make you aware of the hazards that can occur 'in the line of fire', to learn to recognize them and to help each other stay out of the line of fire.

What does 'in the line of fire' mean?

In the line of fire means that you are in a danger zone. In that danger zone, there may be situations where you can be injured by something moving unexpectedly, releasing hazardous energy, or releasing hazardous substances.

8 risk areas

We zoom in on 8 risk areas of 'in the line of fire'. Each risk area includes questions that you need to ask yourself in order to identify potential hazards and prevent incidents. **We want you to use the eight risk areas to determine whether there is room for improvement in the work environment.**

In doing so, we are providing an opportunity for those working on the frontline to raise concerns in an open and transparent way, to raise problems and dilemmas and to address issues. **This ultimately contributes to safe working, your own safety and the safety of others.**

WHAT'S THE CAMPAIGN ABOUT?

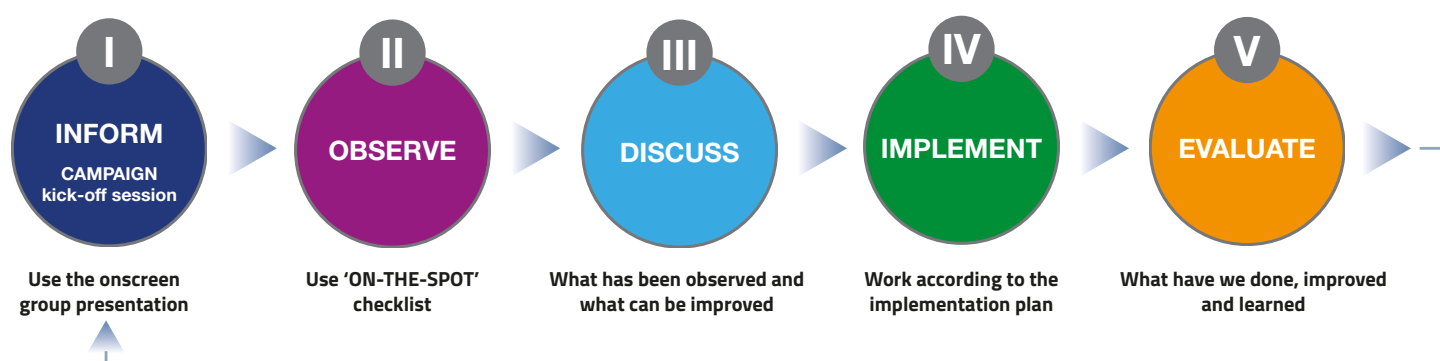
